✠ INTRODUCTORY RITES ✠

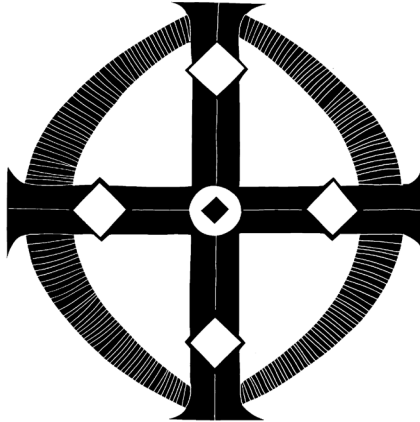
*The service begins as the priest processes to the entrance of the church.

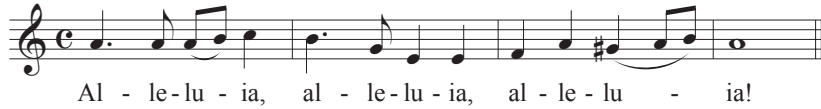
